CLAS' New Year's Resolution: Increase Achievement, Attendance, and Punctuality

It is difficult to escape the tradition of resolutions that comes with the New Year. With the newness comes the perfect time for reflection and for refocusing. CLAS is setting a goal of increasing our achievement on the state standardized tests, our percentage of students who attend school daily, and our the number of students of who come to school on time.

The importance of achievement speaks for itself, while attendance and being to school on time are directly related to substantial additional revenue for our school. In order for resolutions to be successful, it is suggested that short-term goals be set with tangible and measurable results.

With achievement we are attempting to be more focused instructionally with use of strategies that better teach the conceptual thinking skills and be more focused with students who are in need of intervention in math and reading.

With attendance, we are planning to reward students who come to school everyday with certificates and to offer school-wide incentives, if we can increase out attendance rates by at least 5 percentage points over the next three months.

With punctuality, we are intending to offer incentives as well, but for those families who continue to be chronically late, it has been recommended that they be considered for suspension or even expulsion in a similar way to other schools.

In order for us to have success, then we need the continued support of the CLAS community. Come to school, be on time, and increase our chances for increased academic success.

Are You Scheduled? Parent Conference Week is January 25-29

CLAS will be holding its care provider or a parent conferences during the week of January 25-January 30. These are important scheduled times for you to connect with the student advocate to have a sense of how your student is progressing in his/her learning, as a means to preview what will be indicated on your child's upcoming learning records, and to find out how you can best support your child's learning. Make sure you are scheduled in today by contacting your student advocate or your office manager. Here are some tips for a successful parent conference:

- Ask your child if there is anything that he would like you to discuss with the teacher.
- Jot down everything that you want to talk about at the conference.
- Arrive promptly or a few minutes early.
- Begin with positive comments about the teacher or classroom.
- Avoid lengthy discussions of topics that are not related to the purpose of the conference.
- Be open-minded to suggestions from the teacher.
- Keep your emotions under control.
- Take notes about what has been discussed to share with your child.
- Express appreciation for the conference.
